### THE ADVENT SEASON

This Sunday sees the beginning of the Advent Season during which we prepare ourselves to welcome Christ at Christmas. Advent is a wonderful time for reflection and preparation and it is sometimes easy to forget that the season of Christmas doesn't actually begin until Christmas Day! The eldest child in each family will be bringing home a leaflet today outlining the significance of Advent, suggesting some family prayers and simple activities, and summarising services and events which will be taking place at school and in the parish. We are also sending out calendars from the parish which summarise the key events taking place at St. Joseph's Church. On Monday, we will be launching our annual Advent Appeal for Mission Together. The motto of the charity is "Children helping children". This year, the focus is on supporting child refugees in Jordan to access education. Many of you will be aware that


