NEXT WEEK BAGS2SCHOOL COLLECTION


Our next **BAGS2SCHOOL** collection will take place on

PLAYTIME SNACKS

Through the Government Fruit and Vegetable Scheme, snacks are provided for the children at morning playtimes. If your child brings in their own snack, these items should also be a piece of fresh fruit or vegetables.

Sweets, chocolates, pastries, biscuits and cakes are not allowed please.

Also, water bottles should only contain water, not flavoured drinks, juice or squash.

A reminder that we encourage healthy and balanced packed lunches. Sweets and chocolate are not permitted.

problem".


