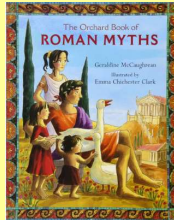
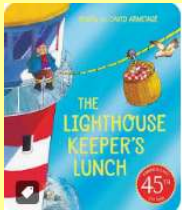

Reading

Reading continues to be an important focus both in school and at home. The class teacher will read out loud daily, and the children will also benefit from daily independent reading time.

It is very important to listen to your child read out loud daily at home. Please ask questions about the text to help develop their comprehension skills; improving this deeper level of understanding is vital for their success across the entire curriculum.

RE

We are following the RED scheme for RE. We will work to deepen our understanding of scripture and faith.

The children will also have opportunities to take part in daily worship.

Science

This term, we will study the following topics:

The Purple Mash computing scheme covers the following topics this term:

- Coding
- Touch typing
- Presentations

We will follow the Ten Ten RSHE programme which works to nurture the children's spiritual growth, personal development and social responsibility by sharing inspiring, creative content delivered through a Catholic lens.

Art and Design

This term, the children will be creating their own Styrofoam printing piece using Roman mosaics as inspiration.

Design and Technology

In our food and nutrition topic this term, the children will learn how to make Roman honey cakes.

Geography

- Location of features in my local area.

- How is land used in New Delhi and how does this compare with my local area?

History

In this exciting topic, the children will learn how the Romans changed Britain. We will be looking at:

- Comparing Celtic dwellings to Roman settlements.
- Roman legacy in art.
- Famous Roman roads and towns.
- Roman baths.
